SeeSaw The Seesaw app is a brilliant tool for communication between nursery and home. Parents and carers can be kept up to date with their child's progress, interests and life in nursery via photographs, videos and notes. These can be accessed on your phone or computer. If you are struggling with the app or would like any further information on how to use Seesaw, then please speak to a member of the nursery team who will be happy to help you. (Please note: being connected to Seesaw will allow you to download your child's photographs/profile at the end of the year and keep it as a record of their time and achievements at nursery).

Don't forget to keep an eye on the school website to keep up to date with recent nursery events and photographs The nursery newsletter, dinner menu and photographs are posted on the website too (www.ballykeeps.org.uk).

During the month of January our focus of interest will be 'Winter' & 'Arctic Animals', and in February, 'People Who Help Us'. We will also talk about Chinese New Year and Valentine's day. We will discuss how to keep safe and warm in winter, feeding the birds, people in the community who help us, cultural differences around the world, and we will support the children's recognition of colours, patterns and shapes. Please work with us in supporting your child's learning by encouraging them to identify and match colours and shapes. Our numeracy focus in pre-school includes counting to 10, and above if the child is able, and to recognise some numbers. We will also be encouraging the children to count objects, focusing on 1-5 this term, and above if the child is able. You can encourage your child at home by getting them to count, e.g. their birthday candles, their toys, fingers or toes, etc.

Please note that school will be closed from Monday 15th - Friday 19th February for the mid-term break. School will reopen on Monday 22<sup>nd</sup> February for the second half of term two. We hope that everyone has a safe and enjoyable break!

# Self Help Skills

The children are settling into a good lunch time routine and becoming quite independent with other Nursery routines as well. We would ask that together, we support your child's developing self-help skills. Encourage them to put on and take off their own coat, use their knife and fork, set the table or tidy away their toys after play times, help to dress themselves, be more independent in their own toileting needs, etc. at home as well as at nursery. Often parents are pleasantly surprised at just how much their young child can do!

#### Covid-19

As there has been a significant increase in the number of cases of Covid across Northern Ireland, we would like to remind you to please follow the regulations for Covid-19 around Nursery;

- Please limit the number of people bringing/collecting children from nursery to one (anyone collecting a nursery child must be 16+ years old).
- Please wear face coverings when on school premises, unless medically exempt.
- Use the sanitiser provided outside the classroom door before your child enters the classroom.
- Be mindful of social distancing with other parents and staff, and adhere to government guidelines.
- Please keep personal belongings (toys and comforters, etc.) at home. A teacher will liaise with you if it is felt that your child would benefit from extra provision to support their transition into the classroom.
- If your child is not feeling well or displaying ANY symptoms of Covid-19 please keep them at home a new or continuous cough, high temperature or change/loss in taste or smell.
- Please do not give your child medication which might mask a temperature before coming into school (this may prohibit staff from identifying symptoms of concern during the nursery session).
