We have been reinforcing 2D shapes – ensure your child can recognise:

- Triangle
- Square
- Rectangle
- circle

Autumn Leaves

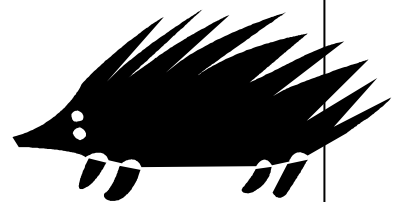
Yellow, red, green and brown
