#### Literacy

Your child will be learning how to write their name. Practise this at home. Please refer to your handwriting sheet (given out in information pack in June) for further quidance. Remember — <u>no capital letters!</u>

We will be teaching them to hold their pencil correctly — using "froggy fingers". Ask your teacher if you're unsure what this means!

Every day in P1 we have a story time. Why not continue this routine at bed time... time for a story! This will help your child improve their concentration and prepare for learning to read.

#### Mad about Maths

From now until Halloween, maths activities will include sorting, sequencing, counting 1-5, writing the numbers 1-5 and making sets of up to 5 items and learning colours. These will be taught through practical, fun activities.

Encourage your child to count in practical, everyday situations, for example, setting the table — how many forks do we need? At the supermarket you could ask your child to get you \_\_\_\_ apples etc. How about sorting the laundry? Shirts in one pile, socks in another pile etc.
