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## Safer Internet Day



Safer Internet Day took place on Tuesday 7th February all across the UK. This year the theme was 'Want to talk about it? Making space for conversations about life online.' During the week, staff revised the 'SMART' rules with the children and spent time discussing how they can be safe online.

The aim of our lessons was to give children the opportunity to chat about their positive and negative experiences using the internet in school and at home. We are aware that children have access to a range of devices, apps, online games and social network sites, and need to be reminded of how to use these wisely. The Safer Internet Day website (<https://saferinternet.org.uk/safer-internet-day/safer-internet-day-2023>) gave staff access to a range of resources to use with the children to convey this message.



The younger classes read ebooks from the SID website - Digi Duck's Big Decision, Smartie the Penguin and Hanni and The Magic Window. P4 and P5 classes watched an animated video called 'The Adventures of Kara, Winston and the Smart Crew'. P6 used the BBC Live online safety lesson and created a Digital Defence Squad character. P7 talked about the digital footprints that we can leave online and highlighted the age restriction of social media and gaming sites.



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The stories, videos and activities conveyed the message of online safety in a simple and relatable way for the children to understand. They generated important discussions and helped the children to identify the possible dangers of being online and how to avoid these. Staff highlighted the importance of asking permission and getting support from parents/carers at home when using the internet. The children also thought about how important it is to tell an adult at home if they feel worried or concerned about inappropriate messages or comments received online.
