Please remember to collect your child's paintings, drawings and creations and celebrate their creativity by asking them about their work and praising them for their efforts. These types of conversations will help to develop your child's confidence to talk about new subjects and their interests. 'Show and Tell'

will begin in term three, after Easter, and this will encourage the children to increase and extend their confidence when speaking in small groups. When this starts we would ask for your support to keep the number of items and toys coming into nursery limited until the dedicated 'show and tell' day (Friday of each week). This can be an opportunity for your child to share any news or interests they have, perhaps showing a photograph of a new baby or recent trip (to the doctor, dentist, on holiday, etc.) or an item supporting our topic of interest for the month. Please do not send anything of value into school as we can not take responsibility for broken or misplaced items.

<u>Helping Nursery</u>: Thank you for contributing to our "Junk Art" box. The children really enjoy this type of craft and your efforts are very much appreciated. <u>For health and safety we ask that you do not send the cardboard</u> <u>tubes from the inside of toilet rolls and no plastic bags</u>. Thank you. If you have any old mobile phones, computer monitor/keyboard/mouse, sets of locks and keys, books, 1st size baby clothes, items for our mud kitchen or craft items you can donate them to nursery for imaginative play for the children. Your old Christmas or birthday cards can be used to help the children practice their scissor handling skills.

<u>Dinner Money/Nursery Fund</u>: Please remember that dinner money and nursery fund **must be paid on a Monday** (or the first day of the nursery week) to facilitate the smooth running of the nursery. Please try to include the correct amounts. Thank you.

### How to help at home...

**Speech and language development:** We would encourage all parents and carers to take the time at home and talk with your children. This may seem like a simple thing but the benefits to your children are huge. Speech and Language will develop at a far greater rate when you interact with your child and model how to speak clearly. Here are some ideas to try (if you aren't already); turn the tv off, share information from nursery on the seesaw app, play with your child, talk at the dinner table, read bed time stories, share poems and rhymes, sing songs and talk, talk, talk! Then watch as your child develops in their confidence and ability to extend their language and vocabulary. It's easy and your child will love it!

The children will have new registration symbols in term 3. These will only display their name and will no longer have their symbol on them. This is to encourage your child to recognise their name. Spend some time with your child at home and look at the letters in their name, providing praise for their efforts, in preparation for this change.

**Self-help skills**: Encourage your child to dress and undress themselves at home, put on their coats and zip them up. The children are coming along really well with their independence at nursery and we want to keep developing these skills. If you can, allow enough time for your child to dress themselves in the morning (even if it's every few days or at the weekend, we understand the mornings can be a busy time!). Talk them through what you do to help them, "I lift your arm up and gently push it through your sleeve", etc. Let them try to do it by themselves (giving them time to try, make mistakes and correct themselves independently), and provide a little support if needed. Over time thy will progress to needing less help, then eventually none!

**Mathematical development**: In nursery we will be encouraging the children to count to 10 (and above if they can), count up to 5 objects (or more if they can), recognise numbers 1-5, their colours and basic 2d shapes (circle, square, triangle, rectangle, diamond, oval, star and heart). You can do these things at home with your child as well! Just try to incorporate these into everyday life or an activity that your child is interested in - it should be fun for them so don't make them sit down and 'learn' at the kitchen table... unless they want to! ©
