# (1) Important Information

- We try to get **outside every day** for a short time. If your child is not well enough to be outdoors, then it is best that they remain at home as there are insufficient numbers of staff to supervise one or two children indoors during this time.

Each child will bring a book bag home every Friday, with three library books in it, and we request that library books and bags are **returned every Tuesday**. This is a great opportunity for you to enhance your child's learning and development, potentially across all areas of the curriculum. It is also a great, and inexpensive way for your child to experience and explore a wide range of books and stories!
- Breakfast club is continuing to run for nursery children from 8am each morning. Please ensure children are dropped off no later than 8.30am.

# Monthly Themes



As well as other subjects which may emerge from the children's interests, we will plan to look at the following themes; Over the next few weeks we will continue to talk about and investigate **signs of autumn**; colours observed in the outdoor environments, changes in weather, and items and objects which can be found at this time of year. The children will be using autumnal colours: brown, yellow, red and orange, in their creative activities and will be encouraged to bring in items and share their experiences to contribute to the learning and understanding of autumn. We will continue to talk about preparing for winter in autumn (both people and animals). We will be sharing a selection of stories about woodland and various animals with the children and will also talk and learn about migration and hibernation. We will look at the changes in the weather and the need to dress appropriately according to these changes (coat, hat, gloves, etc. as the weather gets colder and waterproofs for wet weather).
